Significant Calls of Interest

- 02/16/2019 – Transportation Collision- Vernon – Crews responded to a report of a snowmobile that crashed. Upon arrival crews were able to sustain a patient with serious injuries after crashing a snowmobile. Crews provided medical care and transported the patient to a trauma center.
- 02/19/2019 – Structure Fire – Town of Waukesha – Crews were dispatched to the Town of Waukesha for a residential structure fire with possible victims inside. 1222 was the first to arrive on scene. 1263 arrived shortly after the arrival of the Town of Waukesha Truck. 1222 initiated the beginning of the incident command structure for the incident. 1263 assisted Town of Waukesha with fire suppression, recovery, and overhaul. Crews spent long hours assisting with all tasks needed on the fire ground.
